#### Justin Gray - Executive Director/Contractor/Pianist (United States)

Executive Director Justin Gray's administrative experience and executive work is a result of founding and running his own non-profit organization - San Diego Interfaith Choir and Orchestra - which performed for a number of years at the California Center for the Arts Escondido. Mr. Gray holds a Master's Degree in Instrumental Conducting, and is always in high demand as an accompanist, vocal coach, music director, arranger, and gala producer.

As the Music Director for the Welk Resorts Theatre (since 1994) he produced more than 100 musicals, played nearly 9,000 performances, and is well acquainted with theatre operations, both as a musician and as an administrator. Using his knowledge, experience and skills, he currently coordinates all activities, schedules, and events for the Pacific Lyric Association and serves as official representative of the company and its mission.

attend, and are simply boring. Opera as entertainment can only be returned to the general public if children, youth and newcomers can easily understand and enjoy it. Ms. Keegan is excited to work for a company that presents operas in a perfectly adjusted to a shorter attention span of the modern audience format, where every show is dynamic, fun, exciting, and easy to comprehend.

## Gabriel Reoyo-Pazos - Director (Cuba)

Director Gabriel Reoyo-Pazos is the recipient of the 2007 El Angel Award from the Bilingual Foundation of the Arts. He has sung leading operatic roles, as well as roles in zarzuelas, oratorios, and musicals with various companies, including Anchorage Opera, Spanish Lyric Theater in Tampa (Florida), West Bay Opera, Spokane Opera, Santa Barbara Opera, Glimmerglass Opera, LA Music Center, The European Symphony, Long Beach Symphony, and The Angeles Chorale.

Mr Reoyo-Pazos's directing credits include Enrique Gonzalez-Medina's opera Serafina y Arcángela at the Theater Center in Tijuana (Mexico), The Marriage of Figaro, The Ventura College Opera Workshop, Cavalleria Rusticana, Amahl and the Night Visitors and Suor Angelica for Riverside Opera, and La Bohéme for Ridgecrest Opera Guild and Guild Opera Co. For the Pacific Lyric Association he has directed Carmen, La Traviata, Il Trovatore, and Tosca.
